Many interstate and overseas venturers enjoyed paddling in the Ships Grave Yard and seeing the playful Dolphins in the Torrens Island area.

There have been plenty of other canoeing activities, including a Lones camp, Green Level Journey. Water activity camps at Roonka and a charge course. A couple of groups attended Floatfest.

Training

What does this mean for Canoe / Kayak Training?

At the time of writing we understand that to be able to lead Scouting Canoe/ Kayaking you will no longer require units issued by SAIT. However you will need to undertake identical training presented by Scouts Australia or complete an RPL (Recognition of Prior Learning) process. This will not be delivered by SAIT. In future SAIT will only issue Certificates using the RPL procedure.

There are still many Canoeing/Kayaking Leaders who have made little or no attempt to update their current qualifications. This needs to be completed by 31/12/15.

Summer 2015/2015

Planning is already proceeding next summer.

Night paddles will still continue at Glenelg and weekend “come and try” sessions are going to be offered on (Tentative dates) Saturday 24th October 2015, Sunday Saturday 15th November 2015, Sunday 14th February 2016), Saturday 5th March 2016. Groups will be offered a 2 hour session, cost \$7 per participant minimum 10 people. This gives groups located too far from Glenelg to participate in the popular night paddles a chance to canoe.
