E Learning - Prerequisite

Scouts Australia have mandated that some common training modules ("Common Core") must be completed before a leader can be endorsed as an Adventurous Activity Leader in any discipline e.g. Canoe, Kayak, Sailing, Rowing, Archery, Bush Walking etc. Part of the Common Core is some online learning modules which can be found on [Scout Central](#) under Training for Adventurous Activity Leaders and then under the Scout Bush Walking Course. The required Modules are:-

- Demonstrate Navigation Skills in a Controlled Environment
- Operate Communications Systems and Equipment
- Use and Maintain a Temporary or Overnight Site
